## 5 Questions with Stern regular Bob Levy

**T**he Rev. Bob Levy has been a regular on "The Howard Stern Show" for years. Whether winning the "World's Meanest Listener" contest or just showing up to sit in as a guest comedian with the gang, Levy always adds some laughs on the show.

But since Stern's move to Sirius Satellite Radio, Levy is more involved than ever as he serves as the "roastmaster" for Stern's monthly roasts of cast members and "Wack Packers."

Levy will show off his irreverent style when he returns to Coffee.Comedy in Sea Isle City 9 p.m. Saturday, April 15.

**Q: So your role has dramatically increased on Stern's show since the move to Sirius.**

**A:** Yeah. I'm hosting the roasts, and I actually sat in on the show during the second week. I was shocked I got the call. I was giggling like a school girl. It was a lot of fun. I was

able to talk, joke, write, whatever. I think they'll have me back.

**Q: The roasts were going well, and then you sort of hit a snag with Wack Packer Daniel Carver of the Ku Klux Klan.**

**A:** There was nothing I could do. It was very hard to put together. It was very hard to find people like a gay comedian to roast someone they didn't even know. It was hard,

and not everyone prepared. It was a weird situation.

**Q: You wrote a sitcom?**

**A:** Yeah, we're talking to some people right now. Basically, it's going to be about my life coming from the angle like my "Miserable Men" show on Sirius. I live with my ex-wife, and I'm in the basement, and my kid and my mother-in-law also live in the house and I basically get kicked around. That's actually my life.

**Q: In your stand-up act, you've been known to eat blue cheese from the buttocks of women, right?**

**A:** Last weekend, I did three in a row in Baltimore. I lined them up in one show. It was like an a— buffet. It's pretty bad. When you mix blue cheese back there, you can drop that on the Iraqis. But people request it now because Howard talks about it all of the time.

**Q: Howard has made your career much better, but has it changed at all since the move to satellite?**

**A:** He has given me a lot of opportunities, but I think it's actually better since satellite. Let's say Howard used to have 16 million listeners. A lot of those were 10-minute listeners who just picked it up in the car on the way to work. But the people listening now are listening to the whole show, and they can catch the replays if they miss any of it. They hear everything. So I think it's even better than ever. And that's saying a lot.
